Subject : Disk Errors

Sometimes an error may occur in a diskfile. If this file is a sourcefile and a listing is available then it is generally possible to reconstitute this file using the following procedure:

- 1. PRINTL filename CONO note at which line number error occurs
- 2. PRINT file name workfile1 1 X where X is errorline number minus 1
- 3. PRINT file name workfile2 Y 32767 where Y is errorline number plus 1
- 4. COPY workfile1 workfile2 workfile3
- 5. EDIT workfile3 insert and correct the missing source lines
- 6. COPY workfile3 filename
- 7. DELETE workfile1, workfile2, workfile3
 file name is the name of your file with an error
 workfile1,2 and 3 are intermediate disk files.

Since the number of source lines affected by the error is dependant on the type of error the number of lines to be inserted is indeterminate.

Although this procedure will help you with certain disk errors it should be stressed that it is not a substitute for a backup system and can never help you in the case of directory errors.

All important files should be copied onto 2 disks, so that if an error occurs where copying from the original disk to a backup then there is always at least one good backup available.
